#### **BACKGROUND**

On July 19, 2002, the Ministry of Finance (MOF) issued an antidumping duty order on imports of Portland Cement and Clinker from South Korea and the Philippines. On May 2, 2007, the MOF, pursuant to the Regulations Governing the Implementation of the Imposition of Countervailing and Antidumping Duties (hereinafter referred to the Regulations) and a request by Asia Cement Corp., Taiwan Cement Corp., Lucky Cement Corp. and Hsing Ta Cement Co. Ltd., initiated a sunset review concerning the antidumping duty order on the aforementioned case.

Following the decision by the MOF, the ITC is conducting an investigation to determine whether the expiry of the antidumping duty order would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury. In accordance with Article 44 of the Regulations, the procedure of investigating an antidumping case shall be applied *mutatis mutandis* to a review case, except for Article 12 and Article 14 of the Regulations. According to Article 19 and Article 44 of the Regulation, in order to proceed with the injury investigation, the ITC requests the known interested parties (including domestic producers, importers, purchasers and foreign producers/exporters) to respond to the questionnaires.

#### PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The imported products subject to this investigation are Type I and Type II of Portland Cement and of its Clinker (Portland Cement and Clinker). Portland Cement Type I, also known as ordinary cement, is intended for structural projects generally not exposed to sulfate-containing soil or underground water. Most cement in use on the market falls in this category. Portland Cement Type II has a low alkalis content and is moderately resistant to sulfates. It is suitable for the large-size structural constructions, like underground foundation projects, bridges, dams, harbors, etc. The imported products subject to this investigation were classified under subheading 2523.29.90 and 2523.10.90 of the Customs Import Tariff and Import and Export Commodity Classification of the Republic of China.
